No Temporary License Issued because driver is currently under withdrawal, not licensed or is not licensed in Minnesota.

On 04/05/2018 you were asked to submit to a test pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 169A.05. Because you refused to submit to a test with the commissioner of the Minnesota Department of Transportation, you have forfeited your Minnesota driver's license, permit, or endorsement for 90 days.

Since your driving privileges are revoked, you cannot drive any motor vehicle, and your driving privileges in other states may also be affected. Before driving again you must complete all reinstatement requirements shown below and receive a notice of reinstatement from the Minnesota Department of Transportation. Additional requirements may be needed if your driving privileges are not valid for any other reason.

You must pass the Driving Knowledge Test at any Minnesota driver's license exam station.

You must pay a \$800 reinstatement fee. The fee may be paid at any driver's license exam station or in person at the CIVS Team. Submit other address at the top of this notice. If paying by check or money order, please make payable to Driver and Vehicle Services.

You must apply for a new driver's license. Office locations are listed on the Web at dps.mn.gov or call 612-296-8811.

A valid completed Driver Service Agreement Form is required.

Depending upon your driving record, you may be eligible for a limited license and/or a restricted license using an ignition interlock device as provided by Minnesota Statutes, sections 171.32 and 171.326, and Minnesota Rules, parts 7020 and 7023.

To obtain review of the loss of your driving privileges, you may Request for Administrative Review. Under Minnesota Statutes, sections 169A.33, subpart 1, and Minnesota Rules, part 7402.400, subpart 14, you have the right to an administrative review of the revocation. Requests must be made in writing prior to filing the Request for Administrative Review form in available at any driver exam station or from the CIVS Team Support office. The form is also available on the Web at dps.mn.gov.

Notice for Judicial Review: You have the right to petition for judicial review. Petitioners must be filed in writing, as outlined in Minnesota Statutes, Section 169A.33, subpart 1, in the county or where the incident occurred, and within 60 days from the mailing of notice and order of revocation. If you do not petition for judicial review of a revocation order issued as prescribed in Minnesota Statutes, you lose the right to judicial review of the original ground revocation.

DWI TEST REFUSAL GROSS MISDEMEANOR

Subd. 2. Refusal to submit to chemical test crime.

It is a crime for any person to refuse to submit to a chemical test of the person's blood, breath, or urine under section [169A.51](#) (chemical tests for intoxication), or [169A.52](#) (test refusal or failure; revocation of license).

- Applies to Breath Test Advisory
- Applies to blood/urine search warrants



IMPLIED CONSENT LAW WHAT IS REPORTABLE TO DPS?

- ANY test refusal
 - Breath Test Advisory or,
 - Search Warrant for blood or urine
- ANY test failure
 - Alcohol-concentration of .08 or more
 - .04 or more if commercial motor vehicle
 - Presence of any Schedule I or II controlled substance
 - other than marijuana or THC



WHAT ABOUT...

- Schedule III or IV controlled substances?
 - Anti-depressants.
 - Prozac, Celexa, Zoloft, etc.
 - Anti-anxiety drugs.
 - Prozac, Paxil, Lexapro
 - Sleep aids

- Nothing sent to Commissioner of Public Safety
- Revocation occurs if and when DWI conviction is sent by court to DPS/DVS

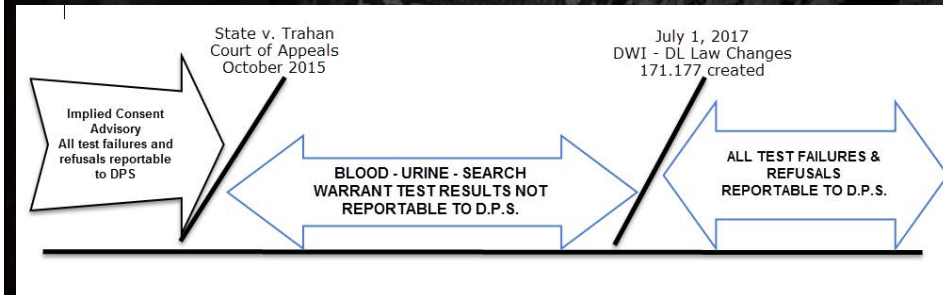

REFUSE

A SEARCH WARRANT?

Drivers have no legal “*right*” to refuse the DWI blood or urine search warrant.



MANAGING OFFICER/AGENCY RISK:



However, few agencies or peace officers were comfortable using force and restraint to draw blood from an uncooperative misdemeanor offender, even though force was lawfully authorized.

Further, a decreasing number of medical facilities were willing to draw blood when the driver objected.

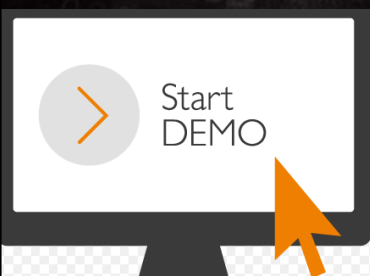

Subd. 13. **Test refusal; no test given.** (a) If a person refuses to permit a blood or urine test as required by a search warrant and the provisions of this section, then a test must not be given. However, the applicable provisions of this section, section 169A.52, subdivision 1, and other law apply.

(b) Notwithstanding paragraph (a), if a peace officer has probable cause to believe that a person has violated section 609.2112, 609.2113, 609.2114, or Minnesota Statutes 2012, section 609.21, a test may be required and obtained despite the person's refusal. A refusal to submit to a test does not constitute a violation of section 609.50, unless the refusal was accompanied by force or violence or the threat of force or violence.

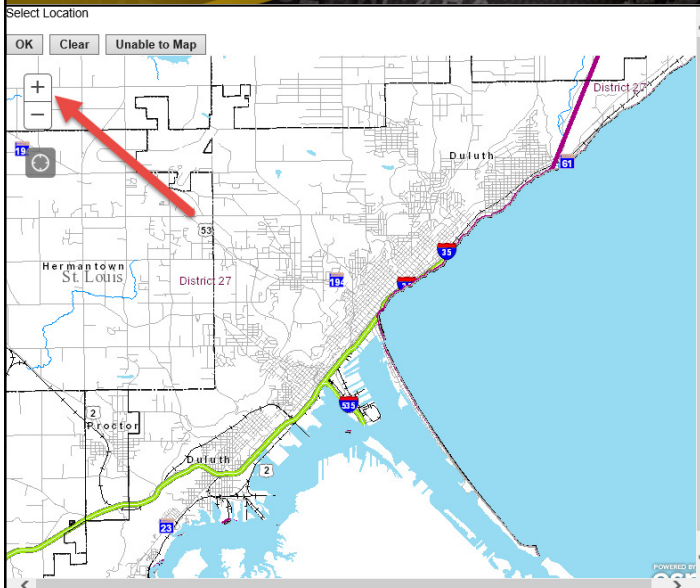

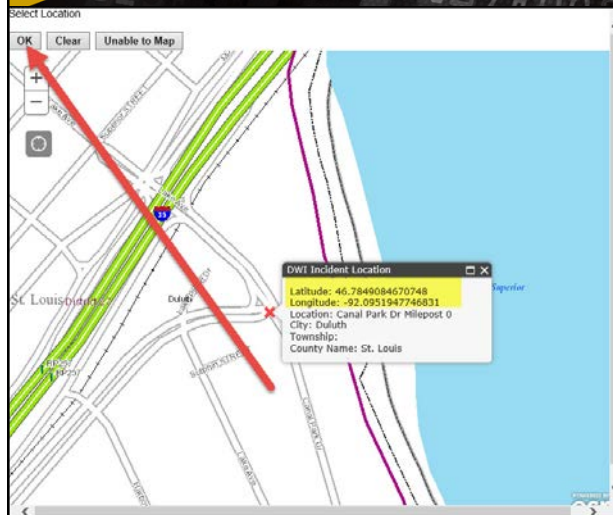


ZOOM INTO LOCATION OF STOP/CRASH

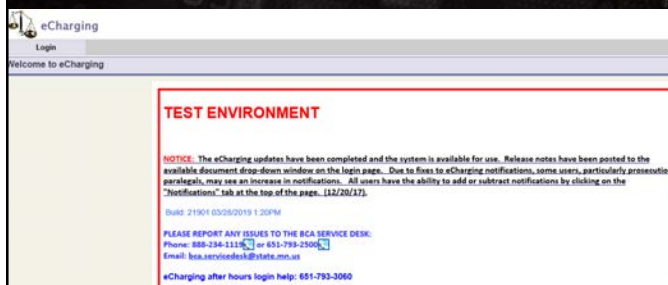

TO REPORT BLOOD OR URINE TEST FAILURE OR REFUSAL

2018 Minnesota Statutes

171.177 REVOCATION; PURSUANT TO SEARCH WARRANT.

Subdivision 1. **Search warrant-required testing advisory.** At the time a blood or urine test is directed pursuant to a search warrant under sections 626.04 to 626.18, the person must be informed that refusal to submit to a blood or urine test is a crime.

Subd. 2. **Type of test.** The peace officer who directs a test pursuant to a search warrant shall direct a blood or urine test as provided in the warrant. If the warrant authorizes either a blood or urine test, the officer may direct whether the test is of blood or urine. If the person to whom the test is directed objects to the test, the officer shall offer the person an alternative test of either blood or urine. Action may be taken against a person who refuses to take a blood test only if a urine test was offered and action may be taken against a person who refuses to take a urine test only if a blood test was offered.



TO REPORT SEARCH WARRANT TEST FAILURE OR REFUSAL TO D.P.S.

Search warrant must have been used.
 Search warrant must be for BLOOD OR URINE.

- DWI search warrant will do that for you.

Driver must have been advised that refusal to submit to a blood or urine test is a crime.

- Document in narrative report
- Even if audio or video recorded.

For refusal, driver must refuse BOTH blood and urine sample requests.

SEARCH WARRANT HIGHLIGHTS

1. Issued search warrants are automatically purged from eCharging after 60-days.
2. Prosecutors and records staff DO NOT have access to search warrants in eCharging so ensure that you save an electronic or paper copy.
3. Issued search warrants need to be filed with the court's e-Filing system as always.
4. Do not open a second window to create a search warrant. Only have one eCharging window open at a time.

- Test result will NOT be reportable under the Implied Consent Law
- More important to get blood as evidence
 - Than refusal
 - ...or urine sample



Minnesota Administrative Rules

7409.2000 CRIMINAL VEHICULAR HOMICIDE AND INJURY; MANSLAUGHTER; FLEEING FROM PEACE OFFICER.

Subpart 1. Suspension for criminal charge.

The commissioner shall suspend for one year the driver's license of a person upon receiving a record of a criminal charge arising out of the operation of a motor vehicle for:

- A. criminal vehicular homicide and injury;
- B. manslaughter; or
- C. fleeing a peace officer.

Subp. 2. Dismissal or acquittal.

If the commissioner receives notice that the criminal charge was dismissed or that the person was acquitted of the criminal charge, the commissioner shall terminate the suspension period.

Subp. 3. Converted to revocation.

If the person is later convicted of criminal vehicular homicide and injury, manslaughter, or fleeing a peace officer, the commissioner shall convert the suspension to a revocation. Time accrued under the suspension period must be credited toward the revocation period imposed upon conviction of criminal vehicular homicide and injury, manslaughter, or fleeing a peace officer.

You will not be able to legally drive for 90 days and until you complete the reinstatement requirements.

In order to reinstate your driving privilege after the withdrawal period ends, you must complete the following:

 - In person at any Minnesota Driver's License Exam Station or participating driver's license agent office.
 - By check or money order made payable to Driver and Vehicle Services and mailed to: Driver and Vehicle Services, 445 Minnesota Street, Suite 170, St. Paul, Minnesota, 55101
 - You will be charged \$50 if your check is not valid (MN Statute 60A.113, subdivision 2).
- Pass the DWI/Controlled substance knowledge exam
- Make application for new license

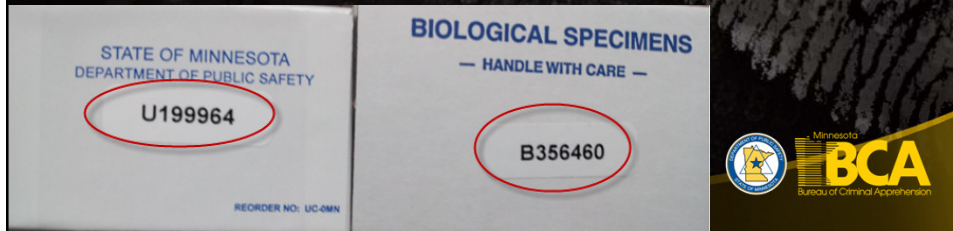

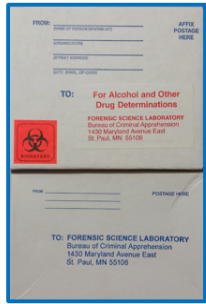

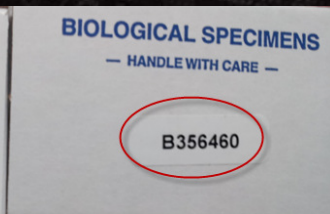
